The following proposal for changes to the CVD By-Laws were recommended by the CVD Board at the February 26 meeting. This should be presented to your clubs at least 30 days before the CVD General meeting June 25, 2014, where they will then be voted on for approval by the members at large.

## **Proposal for changes to By-laws**

The following changes (additions in bold, deletions in strikethrough) to the Costa Verde District by-laws to bring them into compatibility with the CGCI by laws and with the current practice of our associated plant societies should be sent to the club presidents 30 days before the June meeting:

(ARTICLE VI Dues and Finance - page 28 yearbook)

Section 2. Dues shall be payable July 1 and shall become delinquent November 1 October

- 1. Dues shall be payable to Costa Verde District and forwarded to the District Treasurer.
- a. Member clubs **and associated plant societies** shall pay annual dues of \$1.00 per capita including Life members. Clubs of fewer than ten members shall pay a minimum of \$10.00. Member affiliates and associated plant societies shall pay annual dues of \$10.00.

# Standing Rules changes approved 3/5/2014:

Rules approved and inserted, renumbering old 9 as new 12.

Number 9. Proposed expenses, not included in the Annual Budget, must be presented to the Board and receive approval from the Board, prior to the expenditure, to be eligible for reimbursement.

Number 10. Check Request Form should be submitted within 30 days of the date of the expense. Attach receipts to the Check Request Form.

Number 11. In order to facilitate communications from CGCI to the clubs, Board and General Meetings shall be after each of the fall and winter state board meetings. A general meeting shall be held after the annual CGCI convention.

Our last district meeting will be a potluck with all clubs and societies bringing luncheon foods: salads, main dishes and desserts. Drinks and paper goods will be supplied.

Note that the lateness of the general meeting is because the *CVD Board meeting is June 11* and there are two clubs that meet on the third Wednesday of the month.

CVD needs all *updated* officer information also for next year's yearbook. It is <u>very important</u> that all officer information is kept current.
