#### Riviera Garden Club Youth Activities

The Riviera Garden Club's Youth Activities Committee, led by **Judy Unrine**, had recently completed a project to support Narbonne High School's (Narbonne) Student Garden Club in its endeavor for soil for its 40 planting beds on 4 acres of horticulture land. The state does not fund this program, so it depends only on donations. There are currently 45 students who volunteer their time and energy within the garden.

On September 26, 2025, Kellogg Garden Products donated four pallets of high-quality, organic soil, manure, fertilizer, and other gardening essentials for growing a garden. Mike Garcia donated his time and dump truck to transport these items directly to Narbonne's garden. The students assisted in unloading and storing these bags in a safe, locked shed. The onsite sponsor, Cynthia Rodriguez, Spanish teacher, was an integral partner in coordinating this donation project. There was support from teachers from Narbonne's AP Biology, AP Environmental Science, and Biology curricula.

The RGC's Board of Directors and member, **Jacquie Thompson**, were generous and allocated sufficient funds to help the students with their urgent need for soil to start working in their planting beds.

Due to Kellogg Garden Products' donation, Mike Garcia's transportation, the students' unloading, and RGC's coordination, no funds were used for this project from the RGC's donation fund. They will be kept in a separate fund for future use (seeds, starting plants, tools, etc). RGC's members will be donating tools that they no longer use. Marie Hoffman volunteered to collect the tools at her house.

This project required considerable time, energy, and persistence to complete, but with the support of everyone involved, we succeeded.
